# Hauser Lake Loop Safety Audit Final Report

Joel Grounds from Precision Engineering presented a summary of the safety audit performed for Hauser Lake Loop Road. Going over the same material as Director Lenz presented October 5, 2021, with Mr. Lenz stating many of the simpler Phase 1 improvements have already been made with more to come. Mr. Grounds reported 24 of 32 accidents were single car accidents with Commissioner Russell asking if that was ratio was significant to this roadway; Mr. Grounds noted there were very few animal accidents and it is higher than a similar road audit he did in another area; he also noted there were no fatalities in the 5-year period he reviewed. Mr. Grounds was thanked for the work he put into this safety audit. Director Lenz added the District has already received a thank you from a resident for a new sign installation. [11/3/21 Board Mtg]

# Prairie and Idaho Intersection Utility Board Orders

These are orders for the utilities to be moved in order to begin the roadwork for this intersection improvement project. Avista electric, Avista gas, Frontier, and Kootenai Electric must have this work completed by March 1, 2022. Engineer Laura Winter explained some of the utilities are outside our right-of-way so therefore we are having to pay for them but will be reimbursed by LHTAC. Engineer Laura Winter added that Frontier is in our right-of-way, the other two are out of right-of-way so we have to pay for their removal. Commissioner Humphreys **moved** for the Chairman sign the utility orders. Commissioner Russell seconded. **Motion carried** unanimously. [11/3/21 Board Mtg]

Ray Kimball was not present; attorney Susan Weeks continued to negotiate. Commissioner Humphreys **moved** to table this item until such time Mr. Kimball is able to attend. Commissioner Russell seconded. **Motion carried** unanimously. [11/3/21 Board Mtg]

# **ENGINEERING**

Beck Road Project – Ms. Winter discussed conversations she has had with two property owners regarding access and mailbox turnouts for final design details. [11/3/21 Board Mtg]

#### DIRECTOR

Crew Safety Items – Director Lenz presented a sample safety bag to the Board showing them what was provided to the crew. This allows all their safety equipment in a grab-and-go bag for when they are on-call and for their everyday jobs. The Board expressed their appreciation of the Director's effort. [11/3/21 Board Mtg]

Crew Updates – Screening sand and cleaning culverts has kept the crew busy; equipment is near winter ready, contact has been made with Avista to install electric at the Pleasant View sand storage site, our crew will do some trenching, et cetera to keep costs down which are quoted at \$6,761; updating lighting for different locations will be done by Evergreen Electric. An electric pump for the mag at Pleasant View is being looked at for installation and the rental loader will arrive next week and we'll have it until April. Director Lenz added at the cost of the rental, we could rent the loader for eighteen years as opposed to purchasing one. The District will return to five, eight-hour days beginning November 15. [11/3/21 Board Mtg]

On Chase Road, another water line break happened about 100-yards from the last week's break. A contractor was contacted and work should be completed this afternoon. Director Lenz will follow up with them in the morning; he doesn't know what is going on with the line, possibly recharging it from the last fix surged the line. [11/3/21 Board Mtg]

Federal Project Updates - Prairie, Idaho construction bid came in \$150,000 less than the engineer's estimate of \$1,065,000 which will help with the shortfall of funds for this project. The Huetter, Lancaster intersection improvement project was awarded to Welch Comer. The Prairie, Meyer to SH41 was to have funds available in October for the design portion. LHTAC is a little behind in local projects and we should have funding available in December. [11/3/21 Board Mtg]

#### **OFFICE**

Year End Christmas Gathering – For many years the employees and spouses have met for a Christmas gathering. When it was cancelled last year due to Covid, the Director asked if the crew wanted to continue as we had been doing or have a luncheon for the employees. With that, the crew was polled and was okay with holding a lunch rather than a dinner, in part for the reason of how busy it is at that time of year. Savings by having the lunch was discussed and staff asked if the Board would entertain increasing the bonus. After some discussion regarding the lunch and caterers, with discussion from the Board, Commissioner Russell, in the matter of the end of year bonus increase and the December 3 Christmas gathering, so **moved** to increase of the cash bonus increase by \$50 for full time employees and \$25 for part time employees, and also **move** to direct Director Lenz have the authority to choose between the two caters presented to the Board. Commissioner Humphreys seconded. **Motion carried** unanimously. [11/3/21 Board Mtg]

LID Education – District Clerk Shirley Walson asked the Board if they wish to ask attorney Susan Weeks to present the same LID educational information as will be provided to the Mellick Road group. Commissioner Humphreys stated it would be gained education for better understanding of the process and he thought it would be worth the effort if Ms. Weeks was willing. Ms. Weeks stated she was willing to present that in a workshop adding the hard part for this proposal would be getting the money. Commissioner Humphreys stated development will continue to in that area and would not be in favor of an abandonment. A cost participation discussion was suggested by Ms. Weeks to discuss in which the participants borrow themselves, without the costs of a LID. If the property owners cannot come up with the funds, we refund any payments received and the project stops by those who did, or could not obtain the funding. Commissioner Russell asked about any possible way to stop growth and can the District do that. Ms. Weeks stated yes and no

referring to historic circumstances with the county ordinances; as we now have an access management ordinance which provides a tool in which the district can make requirements. Ms. Walson added that when people call with that question, the answer is we comment on what is required for the road and that is our only jurisdiction; it's up to the county to determine development. Ms. Weeks continued with historic information on that area adding Mellick Road was the original farm-to-market road. Due to Commissioner Russell's question about the homeowner cutting trees, Ms. Weeks offered the explanation that trees in an easement or right-of-way belong to the underlying owner; trees in the right-of-way as provided by a plat, dedicated right-of-way, fee simple (warranty deed) belong to the District. However, no one is to work in the right-of way without an encroachment permit and required traffic control. [11/3/21 Board Mtg]

# PUBLIC COMMENTS

Church Road – Shablee Tuttle stated her family moved off of Church Road last summer and they are asking for more barricades to be placed on the hill for safety. Vice-Chairman thanked her for her comments and asked if anyone was on-line to speak receiving a negative. *Note- Additional residents of Church Road arrived late to the meeting and missed the opportunity to comment.* [11/17/2021 Board Mtg]

#### **CURRENT BUSINESS**

# Honeysuckle Park

Ray Kimball, representing Viking Construction as their engineer for the developers, presented the layout of this development and a multi-phased plan which the District has already reviewed. Mr. Kimball pointed out a future park at the end of Robison Road, and a location of a future school. He spoke of Robison's annexation to Hayden will allow sewer to connect for the future developments and suggested the District ask the City to annex Robison at this time. Mr. Kimball is asking for an agreement for mitigations that are fair to the developer, the District, and the City. Commissioner Humphreys commented that Robison was blocked because it is not built to handle the traffic was being used for construction and Carrington is an unopened right-of-way but is open to the City's annexation to take the burden off the District's patrons. Attorney Susan Weeks added the parties could jointly request the City to take in the full width of Carrington under a Road Developers Agreement, After further discussion, Commissioner Humphreys moved to authorize Director of Highways and the District's attorney to negotiate a proposed terms of a road developer's agreement to allow the use of Robison and/or Bean and the unopened right-of-way of Carrington; and for the District and developer to jointly approach the City of an annexation or an alternative to Robison and/or Bean; and to bring the proposed to the Board for review and a decision. Vice-Chairman Russell seconded. Motion carried by majority vote. [11/17/2021 Board Mtg]

# Equipment Purchase Plan

Director Lenz and Deputy Director Stevens have prepared a five-year equipment purchase/replacement plan which was presented to the Board. Mr. Lenz explained the 1996 backhoe was in the 2024/2025 budget year and is in dire need of replacement. Discussion ensued regarding the purchase; Chairman Humphreys **moved** to authorize the Director to put together a bid document allowing the purchase of a new backhoe from the current year's budget and to table review of the 5-year Equipment Program until the following meeting. Vice-Chairman Russell seconded. **Motion carried** by majority vote. [11/17/2021 Board Mtg]

Coeur d'Alene Paving – Ms. Weeks stated she has the payment in kind agreement drawn up but a needs verbiage clarified prior to completion. [11/17/2021 Board Mtg]

# **ENGINEERING**

MS4 Annual Report and Signature Authorization – Engineer Laura Winter explained the process of the MS4 requirements and due dates which is December 1 for this annual report. Some background of this permit process was provided for the new commissioner. She then explained the DEQ asking that only one Commissioner even though this document is for the joint permitting of three of the four Kootenai County Highway Districts; therefore she is asking for the Directors to have the authority to sign the document. Commissioner Humphreys **moved** for the Vice-Chairman to sign the authorization appointing the Director of Highways as the Authorized Representative for the District. Vice-Chairman Russell seconded. **Motion carried** by majority vote. [11/17/2021 Board Mtg]

# DIRECTOR

Federal Funding Application – Director Lenz informed the Board it is federally funded application time with three proposals suggested to the Board. The first project is Prairie, between SH41 and Meyer Road along with the Prairie/Atlas intersection improvement under the Critical Freight

Route, yet to be designated as such. ITD has asked the District to try for this funding; the City of Post Falls may need to be partnered. The second project is Rice Road immediately north of Kathleen, adding concrete guard rail and reflectors around the curve. Finally is Fairmont Loop on the hill noting the school bus won't go that far. Commissioner Humphreys **moved** to direct the Director of Highways and the engineering staff to complete applications for the three projects as discussed. Vice-Chairman Russell seconded. **Motion carried** by majority vote. [11/17/2021 Board Mtg]

# District Update -

Wind Damage caused a fair amount of problems notably the signal at Greensferry and Prairie. It was dangling and Thoreco went right out and felt it was secure for the night. They arrived at 5:30 am and found someone had ripped the signal head had been stolen which in turn blacked out the remainder of the signal operations. Thoreco had it completed by 2:30 pm; Commissioner Humphreys stated his concerns about repair costs as he does not feel the District is responsible. [11/17/2021 Board Mtg]

Once again, a water main broke, this time on Havachur Loop in Royal Highlands. The water began perking that afternoon; the Director will keep a watch out for freezing and heaving in this area. [11/17/2021 Board Mtg]

Pleasant View Yard – The crew will trench on November 15 and Avista will lay conduit the following day for the installation of the light. [11/17/2021 Board Mtg]

Plowing – The crew has complained about the plow lights that are too dim. Director Lenz found LED lights that are also heated so snow won't build up and block the light. The City of Coeur d'Alene tried them, then installed them on all their trucks so they came with a good recommendation. Installation should be complete by December 1. [11/17/2021 Board Mtg]

Light Installation – Costs were discussed for new boneyard and the Seltice yard lights. More information will be provided at the next meeting. [11/17/2021 Board Mtg]

Office Position – Director Lenz noted the District has received several applications for the newly budgeted office position; it closes November 19. [11/17/2021 Board Mtg]

# November 3, 2021, 5:00 pm, E. 5629 Seltice Way - WORKSHOP

Chairman Russell called the meeting to order at 6:00 P.M. Along with Commissioner Lynn Humphreys and David Russell; Director Michael Lenz, District Clerk Shirley Walson; and Treasurer Beth Rheinschmidt. Attorney Susan Weeks and Engineer Laura Winter were present along with guests Ruedi and Susan Schuler; Nick Ednen; Shadrach White; Patti Hinman; Chris Wetherell; Elli Goldman Hilbert; Matthew Rowe, and Richard Abbey.

Schuler Survey - Ruedi and Susan Schuler own property on North Idaho Road at the Washington border. Nick Ebner, an engineer with Ace Solutions, began the discussion stating Schulers want to split the lots into a total of nine lots and continued to explain the plan of where the lots would access. Mr. and Mrs. Schuler continued stating they were asking for leniency however after some time, Commissioner Humphreys saw it as trying to circumvent highway district standards. With that, the Schulers presented their second option of creating six additional lots out of the three current lots resulting in a fee-in-lieu-of cost for each new lot created. The Schulers had their answer from the District as to what would be allowed and exited at 5:30 pm. [11/3/21 Wkshp]

Mellick Road Discussion for Abandonment – Richard Abbey, president of the Blossom Mountain Road Users Association, is asking the Board what can be done with Mellick Road. Residents maintain it and it is getting to be too much with the growth and amount of traffic. Options are to create a LID or abandon the road and make it private. He had asked for the workshop to be about the abandonment process for which he was supplied with information on the process, but the direction turned to the LID process. He continued with the residents' issue that right now there are seven homes under construction with accompanying contractor traffic. He also talked about the trees that might fall across the road that one of them has to clear. He added a third option that is to gate the road. Attorney Weeks explained how a LID works and obtained the Board's permission to share information to the Association for a LID presentation she prepared for another highway district. Mr. Abbey will take back the information to the association and set another workshop to obtain further information after they digest tonight's discussion. [11/3/21 Wkshp]
