Regular Meeting - September 4, 2019, 6:00 pm, E. 5629 Seltice Way

Chairman Tondee called the meeting to order at 6:15 P.M. Present were Commissioners Todd Tondee, Terry Werner, and Lynn Humphreys; Road Supervisor Kelly Brownsberger, District Clerk Shirley Walson; Administrative Assistant Korrei Kruger, attorney Susan Weeks and Ruen Yeager Engineer Laura Winter. Guests were Anissa Gamble, Angela Comstock, Kent Blanton, Mike and Dee Ferry, Mike Gould, and Silip Euford. Chairman Tondee led in the Pledge of Allegiance.

PUBLIC COMMENTS

Mike Gould commented on the recent water line installation on Riverview creating a bad gouge at Snowshoe Road and if not fixed by winter, it will turn into a monster pot hole and the developer should pay for it. He continued that he'd like trees trimmed at Riverview too. [9/4/2019 Brd Mtg]

Mike Gould and Anissa Gamble both asked if comments will be taken regarding Bayshore Subdivision. [9/4/2019 Brd Mtg]

Mike Ferry spoke up stating he talked to someone in our office who told him the 'Goetz property' would be on the agenda this week and it is not. He was informed it is under Bayshore Subdivision. [9/4/2019 Brd Mtg]

Chairman Tondee explained all comments regarding the development of this proposed subdivision should be addressed to Kootenai County through their public hearing process. The District is submitting comment to the county just as they should do. [9/4/2019 Brd Mtg]

OLD BUSINESS

Prairie and Pleasant View BPA Agreement Approval

Discussed in Executive Session, Commissioner Humphreys **moved** to table the Pleasant View and Prairie BPA agreement. Commissioner Werner seconded. **Motion carried** unanimously. [9/4/2019 Brd Mtg]

CURRENT BUSINESS

Bayshore Subdivision

Road Supervisor Kelly Brownsberger reported the plat proposes access onto Riverview Drive and Kelly Road via Patrick. He continued to explain when the existing development (Green Ferry Terrace) was created, Patrick was platted to allow for future expansion into the property for continuity of the roads as required by Kootenai County. A Traffic Impact Analysis (TIA) was requested and forwarded to the District's engineering firm, Ruen Yeager and Associates for their review. Engineer Laura Winter reported her review of the TIA focused on the proposed approach on Riverview Drive but did not include any impacts on Patrick, Kelly, or the intersection at Riverview Drive and Kelly with some discussion regarding counts, turning movements, and the directional load of traffic. The engineer's comments ask to look at the additional impacts not included in the first analysis as well as 40-feet of right-of-way to be provided along Riverview; roadway design plans and to dedicated a snow storage location. Ms. Winter added the project

does provide connectivity as required by Highway District Standards, Section 306.2 that local residential roads are intended to provide access to local properties and provide connectivity for alternate access to nearby subdivisions or parcels of land. Commissioner Werner **moved** to approve the comment letter and that staff forward the engineer's letter to the County. Commissioner Humphreys seconded. **Motion carried** unanimously. [9/4/2019 Brd Mtg]

Prairie and Pleasant View Contract, Parcel 1

RAH Consulting submitted the first right-of-way acquisition for this project, Parcel 1, Crystal Creek, LLC. Commissioner Werner **moved** to authorize the Chairman's signature on the right-of-way contract between Crystal Creek and Post Falls Highway District. Commissioner Humphreys seconded. **Motion carried** unanimously. [9/4/2019 Brd Mtg]

Resolution 2019-07, AHDKC Standards Manual

District Clerk Shirley Walson explained a motion was made when the 2018 manual was accepted, but not a resolution so this is a housekeeping item. Commissioner Werner moved to approve Resolution 2019-07 adopting the Standards of the Associated Highway District. Commissioner Humphreys seconded. **Motion carried** unanimously. [9/4/2019 Brd Mtg]

LEGAL

Takings, Prairie and Greensferry – this complaint was not filed at the bank's request. As soon as they were told by the title company it was going to be filed, they got the partial reconveyance out immediately for the Gondo property. The closing funds and signed warranty deed were sent to the title company for Gondo's signature. This is the last right-of-way acquisition for this project. [9/4/2019 Brd Mtg]

Ms. Weeks asked if a taking would be necessary citing the same reason for the final acquisition on the Riverview Guardrail project but Mr. Brownsberger stated he thinks this one is moving along. Ms. Weeks also added she is waiting for pictures to proceed with the patent on the broom sweep. [9/4/2019 Brd Mtg]

ROAD SUPERVISOR

Bone Yard Lease – Luke Stavros of Ground Force has again contacted the Road Supervisor asking to enter into an agreement to lease a portion of the 'bone yard', the property north of the shop. Also discussed was the use by Citylink and acquisition of the state's property to the northeast. For the latter, Engineer Laura Winter stated ITD wants a full survey with new monuments even though one had been done approximately ten years ago. A workshop will be held at the beginning of the next meeting to further discuss with Mr. Stavros. [9/4/2019 Brd Mtg]

Prairie and Pleasant View BNSF Permit – The contact person for this permit contacted the District stating she did not know how they got to the \$1,598 permit fee, but it actually is \$922.50. They will void and return the District's check and we will send a new check in the correct amount. [9/4/2019 Brd Mtg]

Seltice Bus Shelter – Mr. Brownsberger heard from the County and the grant funds will not be available until after the first of the year. They are, however, working on a letter to release the District of maintenance and liability once it's built. [9/4/2019 Brd Mtg]

Skalan Creek – The pipe size is still being discussed. There is a deflection in one end so a smaller pipe may need to be used rather than the one previously discussed. [9/4/2019 Brd Mtg]

Prairie and Greensferry – The project begins September 13. The contractor has asked each leg of Greensferry be closed while work is being done in those areas. That is being considered by the Road Supervisor and believes closing these legs will speed up construction of the project. [9/4/2019 Brd Mtg]

S Stateline Homeowners Meeting – Mr. Brownsberger attended a meeting recently that included representatives from offices of the sheriff, Department of Lands, and Fish and Game. Concerns of the residents were traffic, the recreation park traffic as you come off the bridge, and people

trashing private property. One resident talked to the Road Supervisor after the meeting regarding trees that may be removed for next year's project feeling she has ownership of them and is very concerned about their removal. [9/4/2019 Brd Mtg]

Crew Update – Seals have been completed along with striping; overlay patching began working on the north end of Spokane Street Bridge on this day. Fence installation will begin on the Bodine site off of Pleasant View.

Vacation Notice – Mr. Brownsberger will be gone September 23 and back in the office October 7. [9/4/2019 Brd Mtg]

ENGINEER

Skalan Creek – Ms. Winters went into further detail regarding the pipe insert. Due to the deflection, requiring a smaller pipe, reduces the water's cubic feet per second (CFS), but it still stays within the calculations allowed by standards, although close. Commissioner Humphreys has concerns that it won't be enough with Chairman Tondee stating the CFS meets standards and if we are unsure still, we need to revisit the standards. Ms. Winter stated the manufacturer's calculations met RYA calculations and she also checked with LHTAC who gave approval of the pipe size. She added the south side of the embankment will be armored which will create a 'bowl', which will build head prior to going through the culvert. Ms. Winter added the current culvert carries more than two times the standard and Commissioner Werner stated he has never have seen that culvert full. The Board felt they could proceed with the new size; the project will move on. [9/4/2019 Brd Mtg]

Barrett Road – A draft was received for the parcels that will be abandoned by the District. Work will continue to prepare that for a public hearing. [9/4/2019 Brd Mtg]

OLD BUSINESS

Prairie and Pleasant View BPA Agreement Approval

Due to the Board's concern regarding the protection of existing infrastructure, a note has been added to the agreement's exhibit stating the updated agreement is not yet ready with the changes. The original intent was to protect the District's use but these changes make it clear. Mr. Brownsberger asked the Board for a motion conditional to the changes which will allow it to immediately be signed since this project is behind. Commissioner Werner **moved** to authorize the Chairman to sign the Bonneville Power Administration Land Use Agreement once we get back the agreement with the noted changes. Commissioner Humphreys seconded. **Motion carried** unanimously. [9/18/2019 Brd Mtg]

Bedrock Road Development Agreement

Mr. Brownsberger reports he has not received a final review from legal counsel and we are still working out the bonding amount to cover the traffic impact analyst and possible mitigation.

CURRENT BUSINESS

Tytan Acres Road Development Agreement Release

District Clerk Shirley Walson reported it was discovered title had been transferred on a lot which by agreement, required the fee-in-lieu-of must be paid. The owners were contacted and they paid the fee quickly so the lien is ready to be released from record. Commissioner Werner **moved** to authorize the Chairman to sign the release of Road Development Agreement and Notice of Lien for Tytan Acres. Commissioner Humphreys seconded. **Motion carried** unanimously. [9/18/2019 Brd Mtg]

Spokane Street River Bridge Agreement No. 95343

Idaho Transportation Department's Agreement #95343 was received for the Spokane Street River Bridge project. This agreement names HDR Engineering Inc. the design of this project for the amount of \$132,788. Commissioner Werner **moved** to authorize the Chairman to sign the agreement with Idaho Transportation Department, Number 95343 for the Spokane Street River Bridge project. Commissioner Humphreys seconded. **Motion carried** unanimously. [9/18/2019 Brd Mtg]

CORRESPONDENCE

Kootenai County Notice of Public Hearing, Moratorium – The Road Supervisor explained the location of the moratorium due to the poor quality of exhibit supplied. It lies south of Spokane River, east to Schilling Loop then up to the state line. Chairman Tondee asked if it is as far east as the new and the proposed subdivisions receiving an answer it does not go that far east. Mr. Brownsberger continued it is due to East Side Water District's concerns of water availability. [9/18/2019 Brd Mtg]

ROAD SUPERVISOR

Foreman Position – During the budget discussions, Mr. Brownsberger discussed bringing up a crew foreman; Mr. Yerian was in that position prior to becoming the Assistant Road Supervisor. This position will only fill in when Mr. Yerian is absent. Mr. Brownsberger asked to bring Ed Mael up into that position beginning October 1, 2019. Commissioner Werner **moved** to allow the Road Supervisor to advance Ed Mael into the crew leader position and bring back a job description at the next meeting. Commissioner Humphreys seconded. **Motion carried** unanimously. [9/18/2019 Brd Mtg]

Prairie/Greensferry Intersection – This project started. Due to traffic, Mr. Brownsberger gave the contractor permission to close the intersection beginning Friday, September 20. Some discussion followed including Mr. Brownsberger adding this should shorten the project build time by five days. It will affect the Prairie and SH41 intersection so they will keep an eye on traffic backing up. The flashing stop sign lights have been removed at this intersection and after review of the intersections, Mr. Brownsberger felt they will be best utilized at Hayden and Idaho. [9/18/2019 Brd Mtg]

Spokane Street Bridge – Gary Douglas, the inspector who watches the cathodic protection spoke with the Road Supervisor reporting a portion is not working believed to be caused by a broken cable. Once the written report is received, he will provide it to the Board and HDR's Daniel Baker who is working on the bridge design. Once that is reviewed, the Board can decide how they wish to proceed. [9/18/2019 Brd Mtg]

ITD Property – A legal description is being compiled. In speaking with ITD, a deed restriction will be put on that it must remain in public use or the property reverts to ITD. [9/18/2019 Brd Mtq]

Hern Pit- The crew is currently stockpiling sand at this pit and it is being fenced to the north on Pleasant View. [9/18/2019 Brd Mtg]

Skalan Creek Project – It is moving forward with the tree removal next week however the pipe is not ready from the manufacturer so the project will be pushed to next year during the dry season. [9/18/2019 Brd Mtg]

Employee Policy – Mr. Brownsberger would like to complete the approval prior to his replacement coming on board. It will be reviewed at a workshop prior to the October 16 Board meeting. [9/18/2019 Brd Mtg]

Raises- As the new fiscal year begins, the Road Supervisor asked the Board if they wished to approve the employee's raises as shown in the budget as well as the increase in VEBA. Commissioner Werner stated the Board approved the budget so we should proceed. Commissioner Humphreys agreed, no action taken. [9/18/2019 Brd Mtg]

Association of Kootenai County Highway Districts – Mr. Brownsberger informed the Board of a planned open house with the State legislators and thought Skye Mercer may be able to assist in the invites. Also provided by Eric Shanley of Lakes Highway District was a new ordinance for use of public right-of-way for Board members reviews. [9/18/2019 Brd Mtg]

ENGINEER

Flood Ordinance – Laura Winter formally informed the Board that on September 11, the Kootenai County Board of Commissioners approved the amendment to the Kootenai County Flood Standards, adding, "Go build a bridge". [9/18/2019 Brd Mtg]

EPA / MS4 permit – Ms. Winter spoke with EPA's Misha Vakoc, regarding approval of our annual MS4 permit. Ms. Vakoc hoped to have it by completed by October 1 but has been going back and forth with Fish and Game regarding a biological evaluation that must be done to activate our permit. F&G is asking for deicing reports and average daily traffic reports among other items so Ms. Winter has asked for the District's assistance in providing some of this information. Ms. Vakoc did say that in order for the District to get approval prior to its expiration, they may execute it "at risk". Sent a new draft permit for Ms. Winter's review which she has not yet completed but added Misha said she thought the Board would be very comfortable with the permit adding they may try to change the dates to a calendar year. OFFICE

Transfer funds – According to the 2018-2019, funds for rock crushing and the SH53/Pleasant View project were to be set aside to dedicated accounts. The Board again felt it was approved in the budget and the District Clerk should proceed with no motion. [9/18/2019 Brd Mtg]
